- 5. What are modern day examples of people who say they are a Christian but are not "doers of God's will?"
- 6. Personally, are their areas in your life where you haven't submitted to the will of God?
- 7. What steps can you take to grow in obedience and devotion to Jesus that he would "know you" when you come before him?


