Opening Discussion:

- How would you define prayer? What is the essence of prayer?

Read: Matthew 6:7-15

Digging Deeper:

1. Why does Jesus criticize the way that pagans pray? If God knows what we need, why pray at all? (v.7)
2. When Jesus says, "And this is how you should pray," is he commanding people to pray this exact prayer? If not, what might he be suggesting?
3. How does addressing God as "Our Father in Heaven" shape your understanding of who God is and how we should relate to him? (v. 9b)
4. What does hallowed mean? Why is it important to regularly acknowledge that God's name is hallowed? (v.9c)
5. Why do you think Jesus placed the petition "Your Kingdom come" as the 1st petition of the prayer? (v.10a) Why is the coming of God's Kingdom important, why is this something we should desire?
6. Why do we need to pray for God's will to be done on earth "as it is in heaven?" In what areas of life and the world do we need more of God's will to be done? (v.10b)
7. What is the petition for "daily bread" about? Besides food, what other ways do we need God to provide for us every day? (v.11)
8. Why is confession and asking for forgiveness important? (v.12)
9. Why is temptation and the plans of "the evil one" such a danger to our spiritual lives? (v.13)
10. What is the condition for being forgiven? Why is this significant for how we live out our daily lives? (v.12, 15)
11. Having studied Jesus' model for prayer a little more closely, now what would you say the purpose of prayer is?


