Opening Discussion:

In what ways today, both literally and figuratively, might people find themselves in bondage? What does it mean to be free in a physical sense? In an emotional sense? In a spiritual sense?

Read: Exodus 1:1 - 2:10

Digging Deeper:

- 1. Why did the Israelites move into Egypt where Joseph was living, and what was their life like initially? Why did their circumstances change (See v. 1:8-10)
- 2. In verses 1:11-22 what tactics did Pharaoh use to try to control the Israelites? Why did he feel the need to do this?
- 3. How did the mid-wives respond to Pharaoh's order? Why did they do this? When do you think it is acceptable to disobey civic authorities?
- 4. What did Moses' mother do to protect him from death after he was born? (See 2:1-3) Why is it significant that she coated the basket with tar and pitch?
- 5. What happened to Moses after he was left in the Nile? How did his sister contribute to his welfare? (See 2:4-8)
- 6. How do you think Moses' mother reacted when she found out that she was able to continue caring for her own son? (See 2:10)

Application for Life

- 1. God was clearly at work protecting Moses as a baby so that he might be used for God's purposes later in life. Looking back on your life, are there moments where you think that God was "guiding your steps" even when you didn't realize it at the time? In what ways might God have been directing things for you to be where you are today in life?
- 2. Is there a situation in your life where you feel burdened or oppressed (by others or a circumstance), or where you do not feel free? In what way did others impose the situation on you? To what degree did you bring this situation on yourself?
- 3. When you think about the meaning of Moses' name (See v. 2:10), how does it make you feel? What might Moses' name tell us about God? Where in your own life, might the reminder about Moses being drawn from the water give you hope in a current struggle or difficulty?
- Pray that you might experience complete freedom in your life through your walk with Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.
