Opening Discussion:

- 4. What did Moses do by the well of Midian? Who did he help and why? What does this say about his character? (Think back to his actions in Egypt as well.) (v.16-17)
- 5. When Reuel heard what Moses had done for his daughters, what was his response? (v.18-20)
- How did Moses respond to Reuel's hospitality? (v.21-22) 6.
- How long did Moses stay in Midian? What was going on in Egypt at the 7. same time? (v. 22-23)
- 8. What four things did God do with regard to the Israelites in Egypt? (Exodus 2:11 NIV)

Application for Life

- 1. Like Moses, who had strong feelings about the oppression of his people and took matters into his own hands, how do verses 24-25 shape your perspective about the difficult situations of life that you find yourself in?
- 2. Instead of responding impulsively, what might a better response be?
- 3. How do you know when to stand up to injustice or oppression, or when to simply cry out to God?
- 4. How does knowing that God hears your cries and sees your situation, change how you view your life?
