Digging Deeper:

Read: Exodus 3:1-15

- 1. In the preceding chapter, where did Moses flee to? Why was he on the run? (See chapter 2) Where was Moses at the beginning of this passage, and what was he doing? (See 3.1)
- 2. Why did the angel tell Moses to take off his shoes? What makes a place holy? (v.2-5)
- 3. What is unique about the way God identifies himself to Moses in v.6, and why is this significant?
- . Why was Moses afraid to look at God? (See previous chapter for clues!)
- 5. Considering why Moses killed the Egyptian task master in chapter 2, why would Moses have found God's words in v.7 affirming and comforting?
- 6. What does God intend to do about the suffering of the Israelites in Egypt and how does he intend to do it? (See v. 8-10)
- 7. Why do you think Moses responded the way he did in v. 11? What was God's response in v.12? Does this answer Moses' question or not?
- 8. Why was it important to Moses to know the name of God? What three ways does God identify himself? What do each of these names signify? (See one name in v. 14 and 2 names in v.15).

Application for Life

- 1. In what ways do people "run from God" today? Have you ever done this? If so, in what way?
- 2. Knowing that God can speak to you anywhere, what keeps you from listening to his voice? What helps you listen better?
- 3. In what ways do you feel, like Moses, unfit to serve God? How does knowing that God is with you help?
