Read: Exodus 14:10-31

Digging Deeper:

- 1. Now that the Israelites were delivered from Egypt through the 10 plagues, what was their primary problem as we begin this reading? What was their reaction? (v. 10-12)
- 2. Instead of responding with fear, how does Moses see the situation? Who does he encourage the Israelites to focus on? (v. 13-14)
- 3. When the Israelites felt like it would have been better to be back in Egypt, where does the Lord take them instead? What is his plan and the strategy behind it? (v. 15-18)
- 4. What did the angel of God do for the Israelites and what did it accomplish for them? (v.19-20)
- 5. How did the Israelites escape the mighty Egyptian army? (v.21-22)
- 6. What happened to the Egyptians when they tried to pursue the Israelites further? (v.23-28)
- 7. While the Egyptians perished, what were the Israelites doing at the very same time? (v. 29)
- 8. How did this experience change the Israelites in their relationship with God and with Moses? (v.30-31)

Application:

- 1. What causes fear and worry in your life? What in your life keeps you from standing firm and trusting that "The LORD will fight for you, and you have only to keep still." (Exodus 14:14) Why is it so challenging to be still and trust in God's power for you?
- 2. As God delivered the Israelites by parting the waters, what did Jesus do to set us free? What did he free us from?
- 3. To what degree are you living in the freedom from sin that Christ established for you?
- 4. The freedom of the Israelites was threatened by the advancing Egyptian army behind them, and the obstacle of the Sea before them. What gets in the way of your ability to live in your freedom in Christ?
- 5. Where in your life do you need to trust that God will still fight for you and deliver you?
