- 4. What was different about the 4th plague from the previous 3? (see 8:22-23) What does this say about God's character?
- 5. In what ways did Pharaoh begin to negotiate with Moses and Aaron? (v.9:8, 10; 10:10, 24) What was Pharaoh's primary concern?
- 6. The Israelites were in bondage under Pharaoh. Ultimately, they were freed in order to worship the Lord. What things have a hold on you and keep you from worshipping the Lord completely and freely? What gets in the way between you and your worship of the Lord?
