Read: Luke 1:5-25

1. How are Zechariah and Elizabeth described in verses 5 through 7?
2. Knowing the 1st Century believe that childbearing was seen as a sign of God's favor toward those who lived faithfully toward god, how was their situation especially painful?
3. What daily custom was Zechariah involved in? Was this something he did regularly? (v.8-10)
4. What did Zechariah experience in the temple? Why did he react the way he did? Do you think that this was a regular experience for priests, or not? (v.11-12)
5. What did the angel tell Zechariah? What was Zechariah's prayer and how was God answering him? (v.13)
6. How do you think God's answer to Zechariah's prayer far exceeded any expectation? (v.13-17)
7. What was Zechariah's response to such incredible news and promise? And what happened as a result? (v. 18-22)
8. In the end, what happened at the end of the reading? What was Elizabeth's response? (v.23-25)

Application:

1. How have you experienced God answering your prayers in the past?
2. What ongoing issues or difficulties do you have going on in your own life?
3. How often do you pray about the burdens on your heart? What do you ask of God? Is there anything that keeps you from lifting these concerns to God more regularly?
4. Zechariah went from feeling forgotten by God because he wasn't answering his prayers, to being used by God in a powerful way to help prepare people for the coming Messiah. How might this give you hope in your own current situation?
