- 2. For 1 Corinthians 6:12 (NRSV), says: "All things are permitted for me, but not all things are beneficial. All things are permitted for me, but I will not be dominated by anything." Where might this verse connect with using technology in your everyday, personal life? What is an example of technology not being beneficial in your own life?
- Read Philippians 4:8 (NRSV): "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever 3. is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." How does this command affect the way you should think about technology? What about the way you use technology?


