Digging Deeper:

- Read John 15:9-17. According to verse 9, how does Jesus love his disciples? What do you think he meant specifically? What does this look like?
- 2. In verses 9 and 10 Jesus talks what it meant to abide in his love. How did Jesus model this type of love himself.
