Questions for Discussion

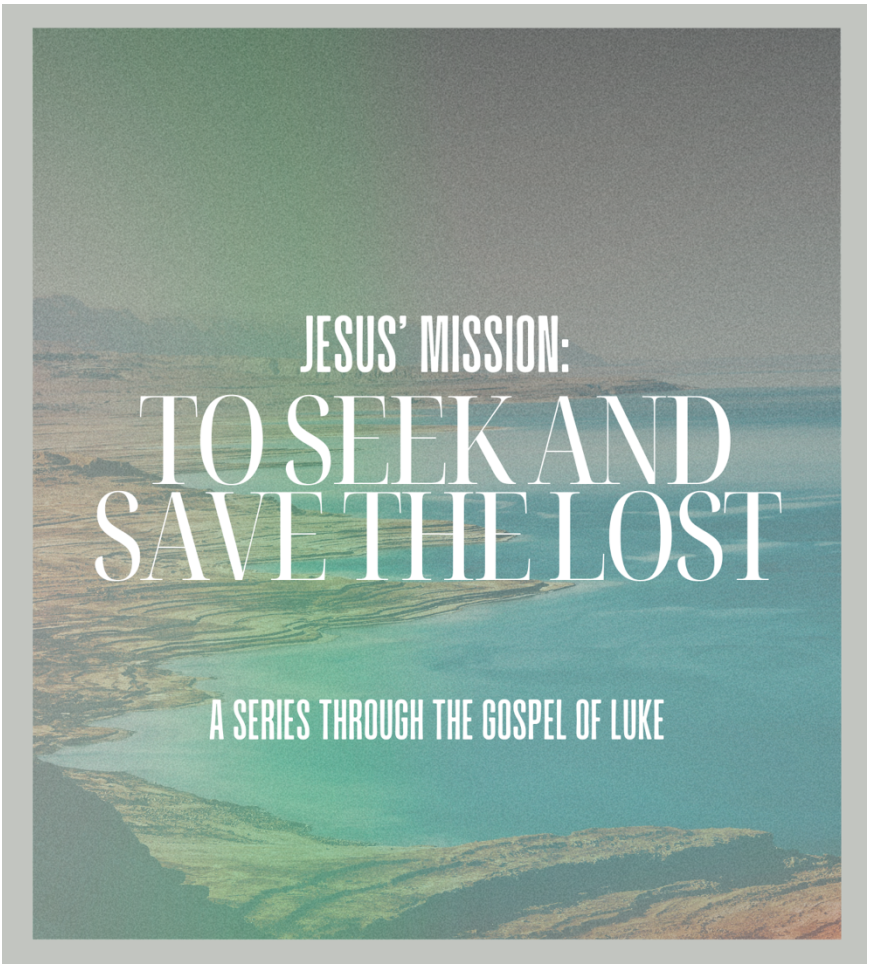
1. Read Luke 5:33-38.
2. Why do you think that the disciples of John the Baptist as well as the Pharisees often fasted and prayed? Why do people fast in general? What does fasting signify? (vs. 33)
3. What comparison does Jesus make about himself and his disciples? How is the Kingdom of God like a wedding banquet? Whom might the groom signify in the Kingdom of God? (vs.34-35)
4. What was the point of Jesus' parables in verses 36 – 38? Why would fasting be an obsolete practice if Jesus the Messiah has already come?
5. How can we as Christians do a better job of celebrating the reality of Jesus ushering in and establishing His Kingdom?
6. Why might it also at the same time be appropriate to fast and pray until the second coming of Christ?
7. Which spiritual discipline are you more inclined to practice regularly – celebration or fasting, and why? Why is it important to practice both?
