Digging Deeper:

- 1. The disciples saw Jesus as their Rabbi, or teacher. With this in mind, what was Jesus emphasizing in verses 39 & 40? Why is it dangerous when disciples neglect to follow their teacher? What is the goal of every student?
- 2. What qualities and virtues are Jesus emphasizing in verses 41 & 42? What does "taking the speck out of one's eye" symbolize?
- 3. Which is easier, to point out someone else's flaws, or to focus on your own? Why?
- 4. What does "each tree is recognized by its own fruit?" (v. 44) According to verse 46, what distinguishes a good person from an evil person? What are the good things and bad things that Jesus refers to here?
- 5. What's the irony of saying, "Lord, Lord" but not doing what Jesus says? Is Jesus speaking of strict obedience and adherence to his teachings? What do we do when we fall short?
- 6. What does putting Jesus' teachings into practice look like? What's the alternative?

Application for Life

- 1. How are we to learn from Jesus today? For you personally, what gets in the way of this?
- 2. How well do you know Jesus' teachings?
- 3. Why is it more helpful to learn about the ways of Jesus in small groups, rather than simply on your own?
- 4. What are some ways in your life that are not in line with Jesus' teachings and what steps can you take to overcome them?


