Read: Luke 24:13-35

- 1. Why do you think the two disciples were walking away from Jerusalem on the day Jesus rose from the dead? Why didn't they recognize Jesus? (v.13-17)
- 2. What is ironic about Jesus' questions to the two disciples? (v.17-19a)
- 3. What was the disciples' view about who Jesus was? What were their expectations about him? How did the crucifixion change that view? What do you think they were feeling? (19b-21)
- 4. What astounded the disciples? Did they believe their testimony? How do you know? (v.22-24, also v.13)
- 5. What was Jesus' response to them? What did he do to help them believe? (v.25-27)
- 6. Why did the disciples offer Jesus hospitality? Were there other reasons? (v.28-29, 32)
- 7. What caused the disciples to be able to recognize Jesus? What happened when they did? Did that seem to bother or disturb them at all? (v.30-32)
- 8. Why did the disciples rush back to Jerusalem? Why didn't they wait till morning when it was safer? (v. 33, also 28)
- 9. What did the Eleven tell the two other disciples when they returned?

- 1. What steps can you take to increase your faith through understanding the scriptures better?
- 2. Why is it important to share your spiritual experiences with other believers? What is something you can share with others in your small group or on your ministry team?
