Read 1 John 3:1a

- 1. How is God the Father's love for us described in this verse, and how would you put this in your own words?
- 2. What has God's love accomplished for us according to this passage?
- 3. What does it mean to be a child of God? When do you most feel like a child of God?

Read Colossians 3:12-17

- 1. What label does Paul give followers of Christ described in the opening of verse 12? What does it mean to be holy and dearly loved?
- 2. As the God's chosen people were delivered from slavery in Egypt in the Old Testament, how would you describe and contrast the redemption and deliverance of the followers of Jesus?
- 3. How are God's chosen ones commanded to clothe themselves? What does that look like in everyday life? (v.12b)
- 4. What does it mean to bear with one another? Why is forgiveness so important in the life of a Christian? What makes it challenging? What is our motivation to do so? (v.13)
- 5. How does love bring about unity? Where have you seen evidence of this in your own life? Where do you see unity challenged? (v.14)

- 7. How many times is gratitude and thanksgiving mentioned in verses 15-17? Why do you think Paul emphasizes it so?
- 8. How are believers to let the message of Christ dwell among them? How are we to do this, and what's an example from your own life? (v.16)
- 9. What is the goal behind everything we do in life? When is this most natural for you? When can it be challenging? (v.17)
