Isaiah 64:1-9

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down,

Questions for Discussion

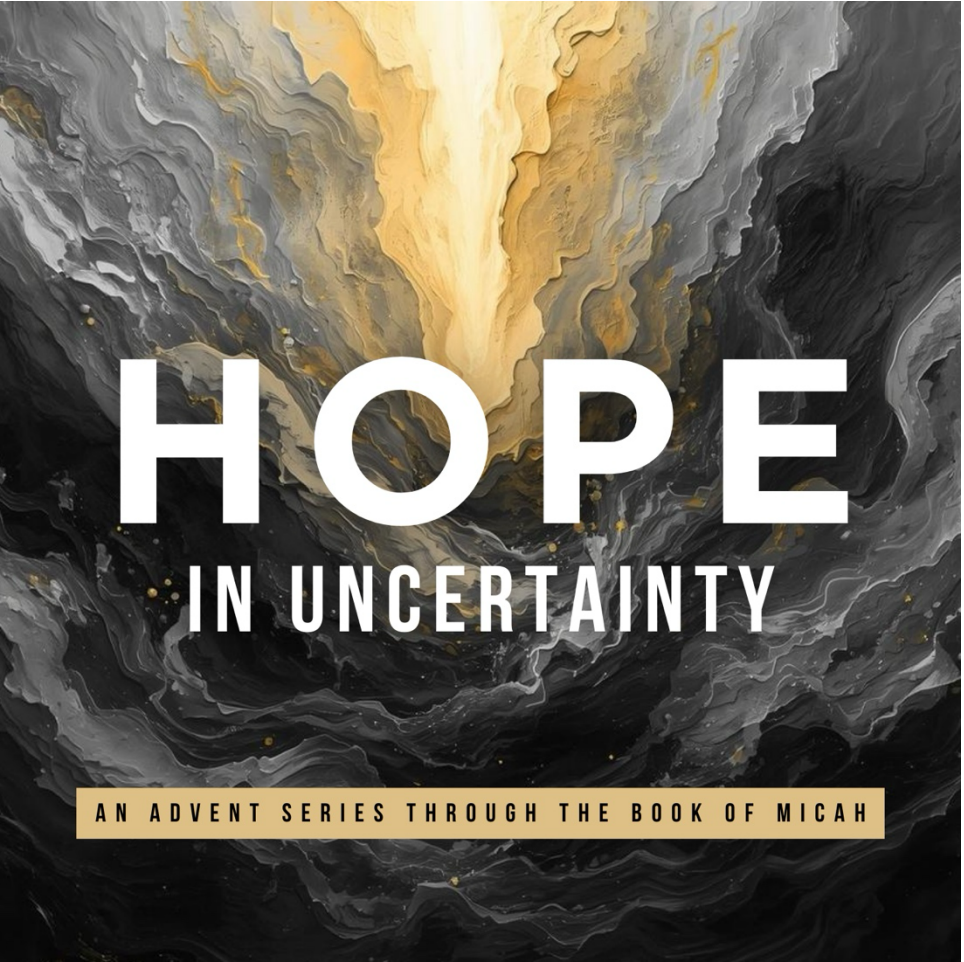
- Opening Question
1. Have you ever read the Book of Micah before, or are you familiar with any verses from his writings? If so, which ones?
- Read Micah 1:1-7
1. Who were the three kings mentioned in verse 1, and what nation did they rule? Do an internet search to learn more about them.
2. Why is it significant that Micah had a message for the capital of Judah (Jerusalem) as well as the capitol of the northern kingdom of Israel (Samaria)?
3. Who is the intended audience of the Lord’s message? (v. 2) And who is the Lord making a judgment against? (v. 3-7)
4. Why was the Lord making judgment against the northern kingdom of Israel? (See Leviticus 26 and Deuteronomy 28)
- Read Micah 2:12–13
1. The northern kingdom of Israel would eventually be conquered by the Assyrians, who also captured much of Judah’s territory and even laid siege to Jerusalem. In light of this, what promise does God make in chapter 2? (v.12)
2. Why is the promise of a future king good news for the people of Judah and Israel?
- Application
1. How did Jesus’ coming into the world fulfill this promise? Who is he king over? What powers did he defeat?
2. How does the fulfillment of this prophecy in Jesus Christ bring hope to us in the midst of pain and suffering today?
