Questions for Discussion

Making Room in Your Home: Matthew 8:5-13

Opening Discussion:

• If you find yourself in a place of need, how do you seek out help? How do you determine who is most qualified to provide assistance? How do you contact them?

Digging Deeper:

- Read Matthew 8:5-13.
- What is ironic about a Centurion seeking out a Jewish rabbi like Jesus for help? (See v. 5.)
- What do verses 6-9 reveal about the Centurion's feelings toward his servant, himself, and Jesus?
- What is the Centurion's reasoning for approaching Jesus for help? (See v. 9.)
- What is the significance of Jesus' affirmation of the Centurion in v. 10, his proclamation in v.11 and his warning in v.12? (See Isaiah 40:6-12).
- How does Jesus respond to the Centurion's faith? Why do you think Jesus chose to heal this man's servant?

Life Application

- In your own personal life, how have you made room for Jesus in the important relationships in your life?
- In addition to your family, who are people you come into contact with regularly at your home? (For instance, neighbors, friends, mailperson, yard service, cleaning lady, etc.) How often do you lift them up in prayer to Jesus? What have you found to be the best way to know and understand their needs?
- Are there areas of your life where you haven't yet made room the Lordship of Jesus? To what
 degree do you allow Jesus's teachings and his will into the rest of your personal life? (For
 instance, in your recreation, finances, important decisions for the future?)

Suggestions for Prayer

- Spend time this week lifting up each person who comes into contact with you in your personal and home life. What might the Lord be prompting you to do in each relationship?
- Each day intentionally focus on a different part of your life, inviting Jesus to come and have his way in that area.
