Reflection Questions

Opening Discussion:

• Can you think of a "mountain top" experience when you were on a "spiritual high" or you felt very close to God?

Digging Deeper:

- Read Matthew 17:1-8.
- Why do you think Jesus took these disciples up to a high mountain?
- How does Matthew describe Jesus when he was transformed? (v. 2)
- Who appeared with Jesus, and why is this significant? What mountain top experiences did they have? (See Ex. 19; 1 Kings 19)
- What was Peter's response to all of this? (v. 4) What might he have been thinking? See Leviticus 23:42–43.
- What happens next? Who speaks to Peter and what does he say? (v.5) In light of this, how do Moses and Elijah compare to Jesus?
- What were the disciples' response to hearing the voice of God? What does Jesus tell them? (v. 6-7)

Life Application

- Would you say that your relationship with Jesus is more formal or more casual? Is one approach better than the other?
- How should your relationship with Jesus be shaped and guided by the following parts of this passage:
 - Jesus radiating the glory of God on the mountain top?
 - The description of Jesus as God's beloved Son?
 - The voice of God commanding the disciples to "Listen to him?"
 - Jesus' encouragement "Do not be afraid?"
- What spiritual practices help you listen to Jesus more regularly? How often do you practice them? What steps might you take to improve your relationship with Jesus?

Suggestions for Prayer

- Pray for the Lord to give you a more complete picture of Jesus.
- Pray for stronger commitment and obedience as a disciple of Jesus.
- Pray for deeper intimacy in your relationship with the Lord.
