Reflection Questions

Opening Discussion:

If you were to explain the Good News to someone, what would it be?

Digging Deeper:

- Read Acts 2:37-47
- What were the two things Peter said they had to do in response to the Gospel? What were the two results of doing this?
- What does being baptized "in the name of Jesus" mean? Why is this important in understanding our identity as Christians?
- Who can be baptized and become part of the fellowship of believers? And what is at least one motivating factor Peter gives for doing so? (See verses 39-40)
- How many people responded to Peter's message? What did this do proportionally to the number of people believing in Jesus?
- What are the four activities that the believers devoted themselves to in verse 42? Where do you see these activities taking place in the church today?
- What other activities took place in this community, and what were the results? (See verses 43-47)

Life Application:

- When were you baptized? If when an infant, when did you make a public profession of faith? How did things change in your life spiritually as a result?
- When do you experience the Holy Spirit personally? Are there certain factors that have an impact on your ability to be aware and experience the Holy Spirit?
- Of the activities described in the early church which are most familiar? What practices are you most active with personally? Which ones have impacted your spiritual growth the most? Which have impacted your witness the most?
- How does the church today reflect the early church? How is it different? Are there certain ways in which you think the modern church should return to its earlier roots?

Suggestions for Prayer:

- If you've never committed your life to Christ before, pray to him right now confessing your sins and professing your faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior.
- Pray for God to show you ways in which to build more authentic Christian community with others in your life.
- Pray for the Spirit's leading in being a witness in your family, among your friends, and in your neighborhood and workplace.
