Reflection Questions

Connecting with One Another

- Who do you perceive is the favorite sibling in your family?
- Describe a time when you were on the receiving end of favoritism?
- Describe when you favored someone over another?

Listening and Acting upon the Text Read James 2: 1-13

Background: James is the head of the church in Jerusalem and writing this letter to the scattered Christians who are facing hardship, suffering, illness, and persecution for their belief in Christ. He is providing them guidance and wisdom to endure in the faith and they are open to the advice from a trusted leader to persevere in the faith. In this section of chapter 2, James is lifting the challenge of the church to show favor to those who are already favored from a worldly standpoint.

- What are some of the examples of favoritism given by James in vs. 1-2?
- Who are the people you pay attention to in your life? To what degree does this reflect what you value in life?
- Why do you suppose God favors those who have little material wealth rather than those who have much?
- What is at stake when the poor are not lifted up? Also, what is at stake when we honor the rich? (vs. 5-7)
- What happens when we live out this new way of favoritism?
- What are some of the ways the rich can use the system of justice for their benefit?
- How do laws provide freedom in a society that continually says regarding ethics, "What
 is good for you, is good for you?" Is there an objective standard by which we understand
 what is right or wrong? If not, then what drives our decisions?
- When have you benefited from mercy over judgement? (vs. 13)
- Bonus: Jesus' "royal law" is the great commandment from Jesus as stated in the Gospels. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind and strength and love your neighbor as yourself." In contrast, the royal law of Moses is the Ten Commandments. Look up Exodus 20 and read the 10 commandments. Reflect and consider whether you prefer Jesus royal law or Moses law, the Ten Commandments? Consider how Jesus summarizes and emphasis the commandments in a more universal manner.

Talking with God

Spend some time asking God to reveal to you how to better live out Jesus' command to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind and strength and your neighbor as yourself." Pay special attention to the poor, those in need, and helpless. Ask God to reveal to you one way in which you can help the poor this week.
