Reflection Questions

Connecting with One Another:

What have you had difficulty being patient for in life?

Listening and Acting upon the Text:

Read James 5:1-11

Background:

James is the head of the church in Jerusalem and writing this letter to the scattered Christians who are facing hardship, suffering illness, and enduring persecution for their belief in Jesus Christ. He is providing them guidance and wisdom to endure in the faith. In this section of Chapter 5, James is challenging the rich to be cautious of focusing on storing up their wealth because it can take the focus away from our ability to join in the Jesus life during these last days.

Questions of the Text:

- 1. Why are the rich people weeping and wailing?
- 2. What does James want people to focus on instead of their accumulation of riches and wealth? (vs. 3)
- 3. What are some ways in which laborers are taken advantage of in our society today?
- 4. How can wealth and riches sidetrack people from focusing on what Jesus is teaching?
- 5. When you think about your wealth, what do you use as a comparison? As a disciple, what is a good standard to use? How does this make a difference?
- 6. Why is the spiritual discipline of patience so important as a disciple of Jesus?
- 7. Who are those lifted up as examples of patience? Vs. 10-11.
- 8. What is it about God that might allow you to be patient?

Talking with God:

- Spend some time praising and thanking God for his grace and mercy.
- Confess your need for God to free you from any unhealthy focus on wealth and security through riches.
- Lift in prayer those people in your life who are struggling to get by due to the lack of monies and ask God to help you have the courage to do something about it.
- Seek God's wisdom for being patient and waiting on his return in life.
