Reflection Questions

"He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums.⁴² A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny.⁴³ Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury.⁴⁴ For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

Opening Discussion:

- What does it mean to you to be generous? When have you experienced the generosity of others in your life?

Digging Deeper:

- Read Mark 12:41-44.
- In the reading, who put their donations into the treasury? How are they different?
- Why would a widow be unexpected to contribute money back in the 1st century? How does that make her donation noteworthy?
- What's the difference between giving out of abundance vs. giving out poverty?

Life Application:

- Who are the people in our society today that we wouldn't expect to donate their money towards the needs of others? Why?
- Share an example where you or someone you know well gave out their poverty in an unexpected way.
- Would you say that you give more out of your abundance or your poverty? Explain, why?
- What steps can you take toward developing a habit of more generous giving?

Suggestions for Prayer:

- Give thanks for what you have and all the blessings in your life.
- Pray for the needs of the world, and those close to your heart.
- Ask God for opportunities to give freely and generously to impact others for the Kingdom of God.
