Reflection Questions

Text: Luke 23: 32-33 and 39-43

³² Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. ³³ When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left.

³⁹ One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰ But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation?" ⁴¹ And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴² Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ⁴³ He replied, **"Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."**

Last Word #1: **"Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."**

Last Word #2 **"Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."**

This series, more than others, focuses our attention of the depths of God's love demonstrated on the cross. As you read the text individually or in a small group, reflect upon the following questions?

1. Answer one of these questions.
 - a. Write down or share what is on your mind this week before you read or listen to the scripture.
 - b. If you were in worship on Sunday, to what degree were you fully present in worship - not distracted by outside influences?
2. When I read or heard this text, what are a few things I noticed about the circumstances surrounding Christ's word from this portion of scripture? A study Bible is useful.
3. If you had a chance to listen to the message or if you only read the text, what seemed to either inspire, comfort, challenge, or even irritate you about the message or text?
4. When I hear these last words of Jesus, what might the Holy Spirit be asking of me in response to what Jesus said in the text?

Spend a few minutes in prayer lifting to God what the Spirit has revealed to you and asking for direction in how to take the next step of faith in your discipleship. To help you get started, open your prayer by saying the following.
