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Reflection Questions

The Last Words of Jesus Christ

The last words with someone you love are significant. When my mother died several years ago from cancer, I cherished the final moments we had with one another. We shared last words, thoughts, hopes, and even some dreams for each other. These final words are still significant since they influence my life today. As we shift into the season of Lent, the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday, we are taking an in-depth look at the last words of Jesus Christ on the cross, traditionally known as the *Seven Last Words of Christ*. As we lean in to listen to Jesus, I hope that we will hear the depths of God's love to reconcile us to himself, thereby giving us greater confidence to live as disciples in our neighborhoods and places of work.

Text: Luke 23:32-38

32 Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. **33** When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus[e] there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. **34** Then Jesus said, "**Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.**" And they cast lots to divide his clothing. **35** And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah[g] of God, his chosen one!" **36** The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, **37** and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" **38** There was also an inscription over him,[h] "This is the King of the Jews."

Final Word #1: "**Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.**"

This series, more than others, focuses our attention of the depths of God's love demonstrated on the cross. As you participate in worship today, ask yourself the following questions?

1. To what degree was I fully present in worship today? What was helpful, and what seemed to get in the way? How can I better prepare for worship in a different way?
2. When I listen to this message, what are a few things I learned about God from this portion of scripture?
3. When I listened to the message, what seemed to inspire, comfort, challenge, or even irritate me?
4. When I hear this message, what might the Holy Spirit ask of me in response to the message?

Prayer:

Spend a few minutes in prayer lifting up what the Spirit has revealed to you and asking for direction in taking the next step in your discipleship.
