Reflection Questions

Text: Luke 23:44-49

⁴⁴ It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land[□] until three in the afternoon, ⁴⁵ while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶ Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, **“Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.”** Having said this, he breathed his last. ⁴⁷ When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, “Certainly this man was innocent.” ⁴⁸ And when all the crowds who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts. ⁴⁹ But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

Last Word #1: **“Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.”**

Last Word #2: **“Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.”**

Last Word #3: **“Woman, here is your son.” “Here is your mother.”**

Last Word #4: **“My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?”**

Last Word #5 & #6: **“I am thirsty.” And “It is finished.”**

Last Word #7: **“Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.”**

This series, more than others, focuses our attention of the depths of God's love demonstrated on the cross. As you read the text individually or in a small group, reflect upon the following questions?

1. Answer one of these questions.
 - a. Write down or share what is on your mind this week before you read or listen to the scripture.
 - b. If you were in worship on Sunday, to what degree were you fully present in worship - not distracted by outside influences?
2. When I read or heard this text, what are a few things I noticed about the circumstances surrounding Christ's word from this portion of scripture? A study Bible is useful.
3. If you had a chance to listen to the message or if you only read the text, what seemed to either inspire, comfort, challenge, or even irritate you about the message or text?
4. When I hear these last words of Jesus, what might the Holy Spirit be asking of me in response to what Jesus said in the text?

Prayer:

Spend a few minutes in prayer lifting to God what the Spirit has revealed to you and asking for direction in how to take the next step of faith in your discipleship. To help you get started, open your prayer by saying the following.
