Reflection Questions

Pressing On - Partners in Joy

Easter is the singular event that changed everything in life and death. As one person said, "Christianity begins where religion ends. It begins with the resurrection." The implications of the resurrection continue to play out in our lives, communities, and even the world. During these next few months, we will look at the book of Philippians in the New Testament to help us live deeper from the hope the resurrection provides us.

Paul's letter to the Philippians is an inspiring reminder that even though the world tends to celebrate division, separation, and polarization, Christians are called and enabled to press on with joy, perseverance, holiness, and unity in Jesus Christ. As we embrace the full impact of Jesus' resurrection after Easter, let us go on a journey of faith with others through this encouraging message of hope in Christ.

Overview of Philippians

Connecting:

1. Share what was meaningful to you from the message this week.

Listening and Acting:

- Read through the book of Philippians (ten minutes) and underline or highlight how many times the letter refers to something about joy, encouragement, or thankfulness?
 a. What does this tell you about the purpose of the letter?
- 3. Paul begins many of his letters with the words, "Grace and Peace". What is the difference between the two words and why do you think Paul begins so many of his letters this way?
 - a. Bonus: Look up these biblical words online to discover their intended impact.
- 4. As you read through the letter, what do you notice about the way Christians are to think? What is unique about how we are to think in the world?
- 5. What does the title "Pressing On Partners in Joy" reveal about the series and its impact for you?
