**Reflection Ouestions** 

Pressing On - Partners in Joy

Christ is Enough - Philippians 3:1-11

**Summary:** Paul is concerned that the Philippian church is susceptible to people who think Christ is not enough in their life. Instead of trusting and believing that Christ's life, death, and resurrection are enough to reconcile their relationship with God and one another, some people believe that more is needed to restore the relationship. In other words, some people want to add something to their faith rather than live from the grace and peace they have in Christ Jesus.

In Paul's day, some Jews thought it was necessary to continue the ritual of circumcision as an essential of the faith instead of trusting in baptism through the Holy Spirit. Paul wants to ensure that the Philippian church knows that their faith in Christ is sufficient for their salvation and reconciliation with God and one another.

### Connecting:

- 1. Share what was meaningful to you from the message this week.
- 2. When was a time in your life that your titles/credentials did not make a difference in attaining a role or accomplishing a task?

### Listening and Acting in Faith:

- 1. For early Jews, circumcision was the sign of the covenant between God and his people. For Christians, the sign is baptism. What is at stake if the early Christians believed they also needed to be circumcised when they became a Christian through baptism? (Romans
- 2. What is at stake for Paul in describing his background to the Philippian church?
- 3. What is the connection between Judaism and the early church?
- 4. Why is it essential for the church to understand that Christianity relates to the Old Testament?

### Listening and Acting:

- 1. In what way do you try to justify your faith to others outside of Jesus Christ or in what way do you try to prove that you are good enough
- 2. When have you suffered in your life because of your faith?
