John 14:1-14

- 1. As joyous and wonderful as the Christmas holidays can be, what are some ways they can be hard or challenging for people?
- 2. Read John 14:1-14. These words—spoken to the disciples on the night Jesus was arrested—were some of his final words to them. What were they troubled about that night?
- 3. In verses 2-4, how does Jesus prepare the disciples for his impending death? What words of comfort does he give them? Where did Jesus say he was going?
- 4. What was Thomas' question for Jesus and what was his answer? What does it mean that Jesus is "the way, the truth, and the life?"
- 5. What does Jesus teach us in verses 6b -11 about his relationship to God the Father? How does this passage shed light on how to think about Isaiah's name for the Messiah to come: "Everlasting Father?"
- 6. How do verses 13-14 inform us on how to pray? What does Jesus say are the reasons we should pray? How does this inform what types of things we should be praying for?
- 7. What troubles you in this world? In your life? How might you view those troubles differently in light of what Jesus says to his disciples in these verses?
- 8. Pray for a closer relationship with God the Father through Jesus Christ.
